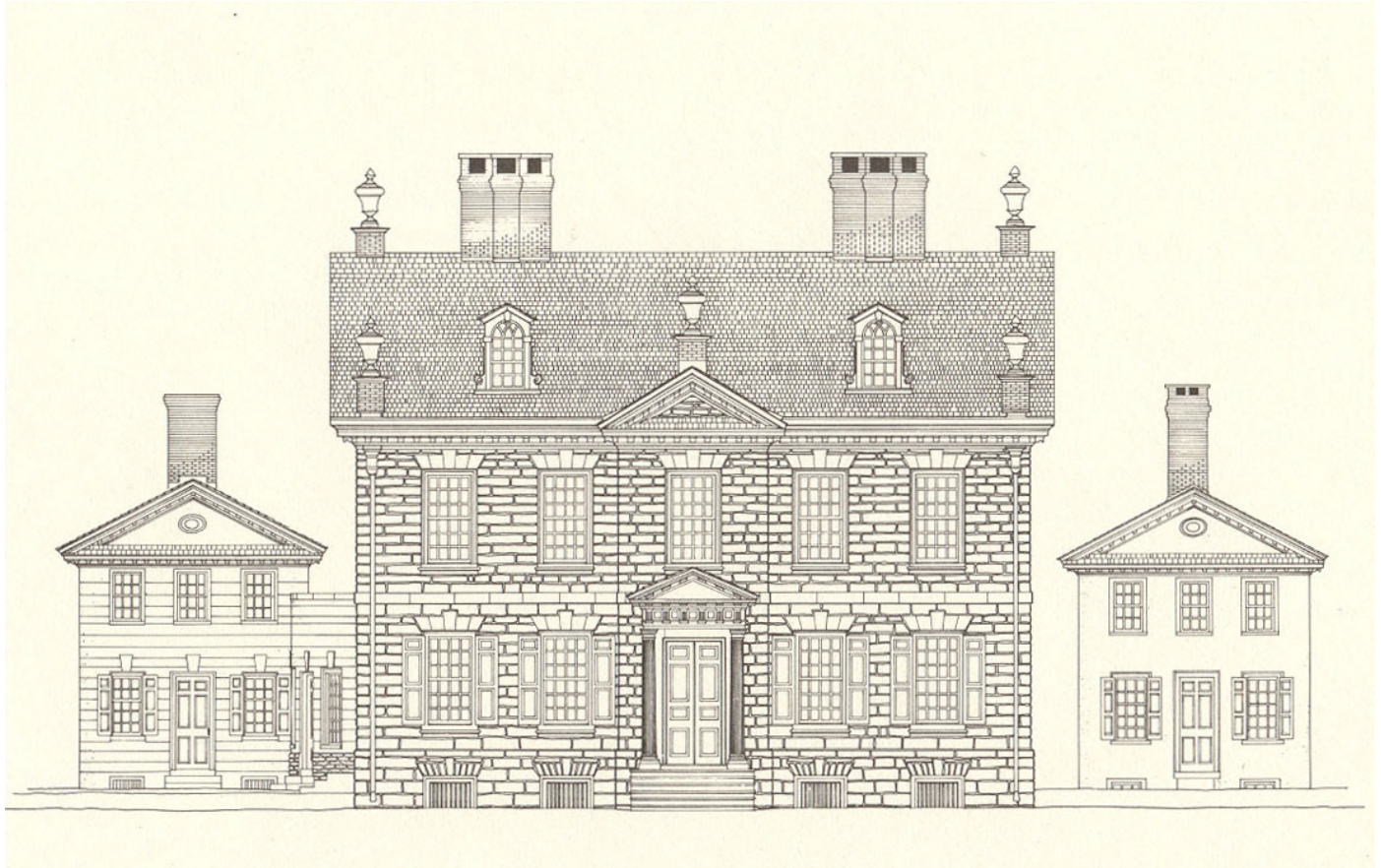

CLIVEDEN OF THE NATIONAL TRUST

Cliveden is one of the most outstanding examples of Georgian domestic architecture of the colonial period. Built in 1763-1767 for Benjamin Chew, Chief Justice of the Province of Pennsylvania, Cliveden was the site of the Battle of Germantown. C. Stanley Runyan was a member of the team charged with surveying and producing measured drawings of the site and house for the Historic American Buildings Survey (HABS).
